Enabling Education Network (EENET) is a global information sharing and learning network promoting quality, inclusive, enabling education.

Grounded in accessibility, participation and relationship building, our projects and consultancies cover innovative capacity building, research, and film-making in resource-poor settings.

We are open to everyone. We work with teachers, parents, students, non-governmental organisations, policy-makers, trainers, and government officials globally.

## Our work in 2020/2021

### Films for inclusive early childhood education

Open Society Foundation funded EENET to produce films for educators on inclusive education in practice. In 2017, we released a video-based teacher training resource: [“An Inclusive Day: Building foundations for learner-centred, inclusive education”](#). The ten short videos with training manuals share low-cost and no-cost ways for teachers to make schools and classrooms more inclusive.

In 2020, EENET launched a new set of videos for early years settings. One video focuses on inclusive early years pedagogy, the other on inclusive transition. EENET launched both [videos with manuals](#) via an accessible global webinar in July 2020.

### Inclusive education capacity building

EENET is a technical partner for the Norad-funded Together for Inclusion (TOFI) programme. We help [build inclusive education capacity for disabled people’s organisations](#) (DPOs) in Uganda and Somalia, and support the [participatory training of trainers and teachers](#) in Uganda, Somalia, Ethiopia and Mozambique.

When the Covid-19 pandemic prevented international travel:

- We radically revised these projects to use a blended approach of remote and online learning, with Covid-compliant face-to-face workshops run by local facilitators mentored by our team members and supported by multiple short videos.
- We created a **virtual study tour (VST)** showcasing the teacher training programme in Zambia that EENET has been working on with Norwegian Association of Disabled (NAD). This online course translated face-to-face visits into short videos, stories, quizzes and documents. We set up our own **online learning platform** called [EENET’s LearnLink](#) to host the VST and other free online courses in future.

## Home learning package



In early 2020 EENET, in partnership with NAD, launched a project exploring home learning and the education experiences of stakeholders during school closures. We created and distributed a set of [materials to support inclusive home learning](#), combating pressure on families to do exam-oriented teaching at home.


Using findings from surveys about families' experiences in lockdown, we developed a home learning guidance [poster](#) (above) and [booklet](#) for families. The aim was to show that learning happens all the time, everywhere, and learning at home should not cause stress for learners or their families. The illustrations helped communicate ideas to families with limited literacy. The materials are available in multiple languages.
